## Faculty

**Hideko Amano**, received a Bachelor of Music degree from the New England Conservatory where she studied under the prominent flutist, Paula Robison in 1995. From 1995 to 1998 Amano continued her musical education in Paris, France where she studied with Mathieu Dufour, who has since joined the Chicago Symphony Orchestra as principal flutist. Since her return to Chicago, she has continued her career as an active recitalist with performances on WFMT 98.7 Monday Evening Series, the Dame Myra Hess Concert Series, among others. In addition to her performing career, Amano also maintains a private studio for young flutists and many competition winners in Chicago Symphony Concerto Competition, Union League, SAM, Chicago Club, Music Teachers National Associations and Walgreens National Concerto Competition. She was an adjunct professor of flute at DePaul University in Lincoln Park from 2003-2007.

## Guest Artist

**Dr. Jonathan Keeble**: has been described as having an "engaging, vibrant sound." His concerto appearances have taken him to venues in across the globe. Dr. Keeble's passion for new music has led him to commission many works for flute from rising young composers. In addition to his active solo and chamber career, Dr. Keeble has enjoyed regular appearances with the Tulsa Philharmonic, the Spokane and Eugene Symphonies. His passion for teaching led him to be the Assistant Professor of Flute at the University of Illinois. A graduate of the Eastman School of Music and Northwestern University, his former teachers include Bonita Boyd, Walfrid Kujala, and Frances Risdon.
